Kelley Elected To A!CPA Council

Mr. Carl N. Kelley has been elected to membership for a three-year term on the Council of the American Institute of CPAs.

Mr. Kelley is a partner in the firm of James R. Meany & Associates in Bowling Green, with whom he has been associated since receiving his Kentucky CPA certificate in 1951.

He was the recipient of the Kentucky Society's award for receiving the highest grades in passing all parts of the November 1950 CPA examination on the first attempt and served as president of the Kentucky Society in 1969.

Mr. Kelley will be installed at the AICPA Council Meeting on September 30 in Denver, Colo.

The Education and Memorial Foundation of the Kentucky Society of CPAs has been in existence since 1961. This foundation was organized to receive contributions from interested persons and to provide assistance to worthy students to obtain an accounting education.

Although the foundation has been in existence all these years, a total of only \$4,000 has been accumulated from gifts and grants. Until now no scholarships have been awarded from the funds of the foundation.

As reported elsewhere on these pages however, the foundation has now taken the first important step of using its funds for their intended purpose.

About a year ago, the trustees of the foundation set up a scholarship program. The program was designed to make grants of \$250.00 each to five Kentucky high school seniors to attend Kentucky colleges. Grants are based on scholarship and other factors which demonstrate that the candidate has an unusual potential for contribution to the profession and the community. The \$250.00 scholarship is renewable for a second year, depending on the performance of the candidate. Thus, the program will possibly utilize a total of \$2,500.00 of the available funds over the two-year period.

For the first scholarships, 42 applications were received. Screening and selection has been completed and five high school seniors have been selected.

The trustees of the foundation believe that the granting of these scholarships at this time is an important step even though it commits a significant part of the funds of the foundation. The granting of these scholarships should serve to publicize the foundation and thus encourage additional contributions. Also, it serves the very important purpose of familiarizing many outstanding high school students (and their guidance counselors) with the promising careers in public accounting.

I would like to urge all CPAs to keep in mind the foundation and its very worthwhile program and to make contributions whenever possible. Many CPAs have begun the practice of making a memorial contribution to the foundation in lieu of sending flowers on certain occasions. The foundation sends an acknowledgment letter to the person or family in whose honor the donation is made.

More contributions are urgently needed to continue the present scholarship program. Let's make possible the continuation of these scholarships on an annual basis!


